RUSH academy school is doing well; we have 2 more teachers and have fit in our system properly. Carpentry and tailoring smoothly running. As we might have told you earlier, we got machine from workaid, and we are making efforts to talk to the government to make RUSH a centre for examination, because at the moment our girls do exams from other centres-Please help us pray as we talk to the Ministry of science and Technology. And also our IT class picked up well with 2 experienced teachers

the ones you helped through their diploma course {Shirley and Isaac} thanks for tensions school for their donation of computers.

RUSH FC Is doing well, they are prepared to start supper league which is just at the corner. The team is determining to win the league and join premier league next year. The only big challenge to the club is funds to run the league – please pray for us for that need. We played with Kaimosi Teachers College and they liked our team which has given as a favour to take any of our boys if they want to train as teachers.

However, its rain season over here and we are starting planting next week. We had a very dry season for 4 month, really suffered because of green vegetables. We had no sign of veges in our gardens so we thank God. Besides, all our business women have been just at home because of drought, you can imagine to survive in such a big group-we have seen God sustain. God has enabled to feed HIV/AIDS people. The number increased because of famine but believing God for the rains to get a relief.

The good news is people like Pamela are now strong, wonderful God! Housing project is wonderful, just to share a short testimony: There is an old lady called Hellen Mutakala in RUSH. She had nothing in form of a shelter, the neighbour had offered her a place where the goats sleep-good side but thank God as we are writing this news letter-RUSH carpentry boys are finishing building her own house. Thank you very much Liz Noble for standing with us in this. This has really moved the neighbours and even community as large. By Monday she will be in her house.

Just from this, the social service officer asked me to go for higher education so that I can be more effective-I don't know how? Now in the government records, we are number one in Western province. The choir, free medical, School, Housing, Carpentry, Tailoring, football and anniversaries have done a lot of publicity. This is because of your support and prayers. We would be no where without you.
