Message from Paul Riseley

Acts 5:42 says that 'day after day, in the temple courts and from house to house, they never stopped teaching and proclaiming the good news that Jesus is the Christ'. With that sort of activity, it's not surprising that the early church had a massive impact on first century Jerusalem. We began our proclamation 'from house to house' last Sunday, having already proclaimed Jesus in the 'temple courts' (in church). Those who took part were all encouraged. We had five people praying, and six out on the doors. Quite a few people with whom we had contact seemed genuinely pleased to have had a visit, and the idea of finding out their names in advance from the Register of Electors helped with initial introductions. We may not have had quite the *dunamis* of that burst of spiritual power in Jerusalem, but this is a long-term outreach and it will build. I encourage you again, do get involved, perhaps once a month, either knocking or praying. It will encourage those who have a desire to do it regularly, and you will be blessed in the giving.
