Consequently, everyone is invited, because they are open meetings, and have relevance for us all – parents, singles, those who relate to children in whatever capacity, whether or not in a role of formal spiritual leadership. Those who are required to attend are, nevertheless, those who do have such a formal role, or who may feel led to take one on, whether occasionally or regularly. Times of meetings are Sunday 7pm (tonight) and Thursday 8pm, both sessions are in the Church Hall.
